1. Blonde Female

Brandon J. Sandford, who appears to have been a member of the skinhead anti-racist gang, the Baldies, had this in his photograph collection on facebook (the photo was uploaded on 11/25/2011, but was taken in Chicago in 2010 according to the description, unfortunately no-one was tagged):



The woman looks remarkably similar to the blonde female in pictures 4 and 11.



There is a possibility that the bearded man is the same as the book ripper, as both appear to possess a similar build, hair color, and rimless glasses.



In pictures 13 and 17, there is a middle-aged Caucasian male, taller than average height, wearing a black coat. His head is partially shaved, with a green dyed Mohawk.

An individual who matches his general appearance was also present at the October 3rd 2009 rally.











Many of the more militant looking members at that rally wore neon green colored armbands, similar to the individual's Mohawk coloring. The protest had a banner from the Anti Racist Action group, which was founded by the Baldies.


4. Book Ripper

Caucasian male, brown beard and mustache, shaggy hair, and average height. Wearing rimless glasses, New York black or navy hoodie/zip front, grey multicolored gloves w/red band, and dark blue acid-washed jeans. No rings (most likely single) or wristwatch.

Appears in 04 1st from left, 05a second from left, 12 second from left, and in 19, second from left.



The individual bears a resemblance to Dan Feidt, but I could be very off. According to Dan Feidt's twitter, he knew that Irving's event was occurring, and made some remarks about it.
